Practical Experience and Assessment

Students get the opportunity to undertake practical skill development throughout the course in the All Health Training simulated environment with trainers who are experts in their field and maintain currency in the industry.

Opportunity for Credit Transfers (CT)

If students have already successfully completed unit/s of competency which are included within the qualification AHT offers, credit may be granted. Credit transfers must be approved prior to course commencement.

Opportunity for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)
